Management of Burial Grounds

Quote from the Constitution of the Church of Ireland –

"The officiating member of the clergy and churchwardens shall have power to permit headstones, flat stones, railings, and vaults to be erected and made; and shall be entitled to charge such fees for the erection of the same, and for burial in such vaults, and in those already made, and in graves, respectively, as the select vestry shall appoint, with the consent of the diocesan council: Provided that no

inscriptions be allowed unless the same shall have been approved by the officiating member of the clergy, with an appeal to the ordinary."

What this means, is that work in any of the grave yards in Clonenagh Group of Parishes, must first be approved by the rector and the churchwardens of the day. Once approved, the work may only begin when the rector has been notified of the time and date of the proposed work. The care of all burial grounds is vested in the Representative Church Body and they entrust the clergy and churchwardens to make sure these rules are kept, subject to the control of the Representative Body.

I thank those who have already followed the procedures as written and ask for compliance from those who plan to have work done on graves in the future.
