Rector's Notes

Happy New Year!

No, your rector has not taken leave of her senses, but let me explain why. Advent comes from a Latin word, "Adventus", which means "Coming", i.e. the coming of Christ. In the Western World, Advent Sunday is the Sunday nearest to the feast of St Andrew, which falls on the 30th of November, so in this part of the world, we always have four Sundays in Advent. However, in the East, Advent is a much longer season, beginning in the middle of November.

Advent Sunday is traditionally the day on which the Church year begins, hence, **Happy New Year!**

The Advent season is traditionally a penitential season and in days of yore, people fasted from animal products for the entire duration. They still do in the East. However, we have kept the solemn character of the season and for this reason we will

use the colour purple, much as we do in Lent. That is with the exception of the third Sunday, which is known as Gaudate Sunday, when the colour pink is used. This is a day on which we mark a break from fasting and solemnity. You will notice that that during Advent, we will not use "The Gloria" at The Eucharist, as this prayer reflects happiness and celebration.

On Gaudate Sunday, which is Sunday the 16th, we will have a celebratory feeling to the day, as this is the day on which our young students from Clonenagh National School will have their Nativity Play in St Peter's Church, Mountrath. The service begins at 7.30p.m. All are welcome!

Monday 3rd 8p.m. Mountrath

On Monday night, we are having our Advent Carol Service. This is the service of light that you have experienced before. We start off in darkness and progressively the church is illumi-



nated as the service continues. It is a lovely way to start Advent, and get us all into the spirit of things.

New Bishop

Our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters in the Diocese of Ossorv are to have a new bishop soon. Monsignor Séamus Freeman, who has been working in Rome for some time, has come home to be ordained Bishop of Ossory on Sunday the 2nd of December next.
