SAC Watch Introduction:

This is a training course that will provide information and conservation training to potential SAC site monitors about Special Areas of Conservation (SAC) in their locale and nationally. It is hoped that this project will foster a sense of understanding, pride and ownership over nature conservation sites amongst the community. This year the course will be focused in the midlands in counties Laois, Offaly, Westmeath and North Tipperary.

The course involves 10 workshops with fieldtrips held on Saturdays or Sundays between April and September every year. The workshops run from 11am – 1pm followed by fieldtrips from 2pm - 4pm. The first workshop is especially important, as it will contain an introduction to Special Areas of Conservation (history, policy and administration) and guidelines on becoming a site monitor. This will be followed by fieldtrips lead by experts who will instruct participants at each site developing their skills in ecology & conservation fieldwork, which will assist participants in becoming a site monitor.

So what will you learn by attending this course? Map Reading, Identification of Flora and Fauna, the Typography of different sites and the Interpretation of national policy related to SACs.

All details of the training course will be emailed to registered participants. Reg-

istration fee is €50 or just €10 for members of the Irish Wildlife Trust.
