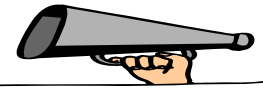

From the Rector:

Harvest Festivals: Our Harvest Festival season continues on the third Sunday of October with the Harvest Festival celebration in Clonenagh Parish. The National School holds its Harvest service in Mountrath church at 7.30 on Friday, 14th October. On Sunday, 16th October we hold the harvest services in Mountrath at 11.30 am and at Roskelton at 4 pm. We had hoped to welcome Senator David Norris as our preacher, but the news headlines will testify, he has been preoccupied with other matters. He has promised to join us on a later date, so we look forward to welcoming him at a future occasion. In Senator Norris' place, at short notice, Canon Aisling Shine from Dublin diocese has agreed to join us.

The harvest festival services conclude on Sunday, 23rd October when Bishop Michael joins us for the thanksgiving in Offerlane Parish. The services will be at Annatrim at 11 am and at Lacca at 4 pm.

Harvest offerings will be for the diocesan Bishops' Appeal project for 2012 in Rwanda and Swaziland.

Funeral: On 30th August, the fourth anniversary of the death of her husband Billy, Annie McDowell died at Portlaoise Hospital after a short illness. A native of Redcastle, Annie spent most of her life in her home townland with the exception of the years living in Church Street in Mountrath. Marrying Billy McDowell from Co Down, the young Annie Caldbeck enjoyed company of friends and the dances they attended. Always a warm hostess, Annie welcomed all who came to her door, whether the bed and breakfast guests in the town, or friends who called at the home in Redcastle. Coming from a close knit family, Annie brought that same closeness to the life of her own family, constantly concerned about those whom she loved and always wishing them to be near to home. Having a lively awareness of the world around, Annie kept up with the news and developments in the community. A woman of great faith, Annie found great reserves of strength to sustain her through deep sadness at the deaths of her daughter in law Shirley, Billy her husband, and last year, her son Ken. Annie valued the celebration of Holy Communion at her home

Together with the Rector, our parishes are represented by Joe Peavoy and Emily Jackson from Clonenagh; Jean Treacy from Offerlane; and Ivan Jestin and Joyce Wharton from Borris-in-Ossory/Seir Kieran. Supported by John Thompson of Rath saran Parish, the Rector plans to propose a motion calling for the Church of Ireland to speak in defence of farmers and communities who face bleak prospects if the single farm payment is terminated in 2013 and not replaced with something comparable.
