From the Rector:

Thank you: We are grateful to God for bringing us safely to the beginning of another New Year and thank those who assisted us in our Sunday worship during 2011, particular thanks to those who lead services month by month, John Bailey, Mabel Peavoy, Charlie Wallace and Maureen Lanigan.

Farmers' service: There is an old tradition of the Sunday after the Epiphany being observed as Plough Sunday, the day on which there were prayers for the farming year. (Plough Sunday took its name from Plough Monday, the day when people traditionally returned to work after the Epiphany). We held a Plough Sunday Service on this Sunday last year, welcoming Mr Sam Harper as our preacher, and had a congregation of fifty. We will be having the service in Mountrath Church at 7 pm on Sunday, 8th January when Mr James Bennett will be our speaker. All farmers (and others!), whatever their parish or denomination, are invited.

Covenant Service: We mark the beginning of the New Year with a covenant service (a tradition from the Methodist Church), in which we commit ourselves to the Lord for the coming year, at Mountrath Church on Sunday, 1st January at 11:30.

The Epiphany: There will be Holy Communion for the Feast of the Epiphany in Mountrath at 8 pm on Friday, 6th January.

Rector away: The Rector is visiting his family in England from Monday 9th January until Satur-

day, 14th January. Contact telephone numbers for pastoral calls will be available on the Rector's telephone.

Third Sunday: Lacca Church has been getting poor value out of the Rector, who on the first Sunday of the month rushes through the door for the 10.30 service with no more than seconds to spare and the Rector rushes out the door at the end of the service to be in Mountrath for 11.30, with hardly a moment to speak to anyone. On the third Sunday of each month for January, February and March, i.e. January 15th, February 19th and March 18th, the usual 10.30 service is being shifted to 4 pm to allow a chance for the Rector to be present and not rushing from, or to, anywhere.

Midweek series: A five week series of midweek services at Borris-in-Ossory begins on Wednesday, 18th January and continues on 25th January, 1st February, 8th February and 15th February, after which we begin our Lent journey around our six churches. A short se-

ries allows us the opportunity of a particular focus and we shall look at Matthew, Mark, Luke, John and Paul over the five evenings.

Funeral: On Wednesday, 7th December George Birney of Cappagh South, Mountrath. A native of the parish, George had a deep sense of belonging to his land and his family. Working on the family farm over the years, George was a well known and respected member of the community. Farming was not a job for him, but a vocation, a calling, away from which he would not have been content. George enjoyed the open air standing amidst his fields, looking at livestock. When not outside, home life was important to him, sat beside the warmth of the kitchen range, with his family around him. George was supported through his illness over these past months by the love of his wife Carmel and his family, Robert, Brendan, Una and Stephen, and in his final weeks by the kindness of the staff of Portlaoise Hospital. George's

funeral service at Saint Peter's Church, Mountrath was followed by burial in the churchyard.

Nativity Service: Our thanks go to Ms Michelle Stone and her staff at Clonenagh National School for the excellent nativity service on Sunday, 18th December. Two hundred people gathered for an evening that took much hard work to prepare and which was enjoyed by all present.
