# Rector's Letter

On the first Sunday in February, one of the electrical fuses in Roskelton church blew, leaving us without power. It was a bright morning, so the lack of electric lighting was not a problem, but it did mean that there was no power for the keyboard. This proved to be no obstacle to the singing of the hymns as Mabel Peavoy and the ladies of the choir led the congregation in some great singing. Perhaps we sang better because we knew we had to make up for the loss of the keyboard, perhaps we sang better because, with no music being played, others would have noticed if we had not been singing, whatever the reason, nineteen of us filled Roskelton church with sound. It might not have been perfect musically, but it was great spiritually.

Augustine of Hippo, an early Christian writer, realized that singing brought an extra dimension to worship; it added something that was otherwise not there. Augustine wrote, "For he who sings praise, does not only praise, but also praises joyfully; he who sings praise, not only sings, but also loves Him whom he is singing about". Singing is at the heart of worship in the Bible, look at the psalms and the way in which they encourage us to praise God. Both the Gospels of Saint Matthew and Saint Mark tell

us about Jesus and his friends singing at the most crucial of moments, at the end of the Last Supper, we are told, " when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives." In the letter to the Ephesians, Saint Paul talks of the need for Christians to "sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts".

With singing being at the heart of Scripture and very much at the heart of Church of Ireland worship, our Lent series this year is not going to be a series of studies, as we have done in previous years, but is going to be singing through Lent. Each Wednesday evening we shall look at the Gospel reading for the week and look at a hymn that reflects the teaching found in the reading, but the point of the services will not be in the saying of words, but in the singing of them, for it is in the singing that they become real in our hearts.

Do find time to join us this Lent as we praise joyfully and love the one about whom we sing.



# Church of Ireland News

## **Act to stop Climate Change**

Responding to a decision by the Church of England, the Revd Andrew Orr, Rector of Tullow, Co Carlow and Chairman of Eco-Congregation Ireland (ECI) called on churches in Ireland take action on climate change

"Eco-Congregation Ireland is delighted that the Church of England General Synod has overwhelmingly passed a motion calling on the Church to take action on climate change. This includes the setting up of a special environmental panel to oversee the Church's response in areas such as administration, parish life and investments. "We would ask that all the churches in Ireland would follow the lead of the Church of England and begin a similar process that would see every faith community engage constructively with their call to care for God's Creation, especially around the damage to the planet caused by climate change."

## **Bishops' Appeal News**

Early in the New Year several vital projects received funding from the Bishops' Appeal.

A project in Zambia supported through the Us, (formerly USPG), received EURO 16,749 to address the issue of Gender Based Violence. The Church in Zambia is responding to information that 47% of girls are sexually abused by the age of 15, by developing a holistic project to educate and protect these girls and to raise awareness in the wider community.

A project in Mali coordinated by Christian Aid received EURO 10,000 to implement a renewable energy project which will see more remote villages receive electricity for the first time.

In Argentina, a SAMS supported project received £7,800 Bishops' Appeal funding for the further development of its Farmers' Garden. Here, people grow new crops and learn how to grow a variety of foods to ensure balanced nutrition.

In Ghana, a project focusing on providing women's vocational training received £11,441 through Feed the Minds to help women with little or no schooling receive practical education that allows them opportunities for business or employment.

In Uganda, Fields of Life received £10,000 for a teacher training programme. Oftentimes, when children finally attend school because their parents have access to uniforms or fees, the quality of the education received is low because the teachers have little or no training.

In Myanmar, where thousands of displaced people have set up makeshift homes along the border of Myanmar and Thailand, funding has been released for emergency food relief as shortages become more and more regular and people struggle to feed their families. As little as EURO 21 can feed three families for a month. Bishops' Appeal released EURO 10,000.

# Parish Notes

**Ash Wednesday:** Our observance of the season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 5th March with Holy Communion at 10.30 am in Mountrath

**Saint Ciaran's Day:** Our patronal festival at Seir Kieran also falls on Ash Wednesday this year and we shall celebrate Holy Communion at 8 pm. As we remember Ciaran, we will remember the place of penitence and discipline in the life of the early Irish Church and reflect on the words of the ancient Irish hymn "It were my soul's desire".

**Lent 2014:** Our Lent services take place at 8 pm on each Wednesday evening of Lent. "Singing through Lent" is the theme of our Lent series this year. Each week we shall look at the spiritual teaching of one of the hymns connected with the Gospel reading for the Sunday.

At Annatrim on 12th March, the reading is Matthew 4:1-11 and the hymn is "Forty days and forty nights".

At Borris-in-Ossory on 19th March, the reading is John 3:1-17 and the hymn is "Man of sorrows".

At Roskelton on 26th March, the reading is John 4:5-42 and the hymn is "I heard the voice of Jesus say".

At Lacca on 2nd April, the reading is John 9:1-41 and the hymn is "Amazing grace."

The series concludes in Mountrath on 9th April, when the reading will be John 11:1-45 and the hymn will be "Thine be the glory"

**Bible Club:** Our Bible Club meets on Thursday, 13th and 27th March. After welcoming a dozen or so children each evening in the meetings before Christmas, it was encouraging that the attendance has now grown to over twenty at each meeting of the club. We are very grateful to Mervyn Tomb of the Faith Mission in Durrow for the boundless energy and enthusiasm with which he leads the club.

**Confirmation classes:** Confirmation is on Sunday 29th, June and our preparation began during February. Our classes are on 13th and 27th March, to coincide with the Bible Club, so that parents do not have to drive twice into the town.

**Third Sunday Service:** We had 55 at our Third Sunday service in Lacca in January and 47 in February. Our Third Sunday service in March will be on Sunday, 16th March at 4 pm when we will be celebrating Saint Patrick and the great Christian heritage with which we have been blessed. This will be the last of the current series.

**Saint Patrick's Day:** Holy Communion for Saint Patrick's Day will be on Monday, 17th March at 10.30 am in Mountrath.

**The Annunciation:** There will be Holy Communion in Mountrath on Tuesday, 25th March at 8 pm to remember the Annunciation of our Lord to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

**Mothering Sunday:** Sunday, 30th March is Mothering Sunday, and is a fifth Sunday of the month. There will be Holy Communion in Mountrath at 9 am and at Annatrim at 11 am we shall be having a Mothering Sunday service with the involvement of members of our Bible Club

**Western Front Visit 2015:** A couple of people have made inquiries about visiting Flanders and the Somme. The trip in July of this year is for a small group of six people and is fully booked, but Ian Poulton is considering taking a larger group in 2015, probably in June when it is quieter (and cheaper!).
