### **SELF TALK**

Purpose: To become aware of how the "talk in our heads" makes us feel.

What is Self-Talk?

"Self-talk" is the constant talk that goes on in our heads. In each of us, a never-ending stream of self-talk critiques and comments on all our thoughts and actions. Much of this self-talk is made up of messages from childhood – we may hear the voices of our parents in our heads, repeating over and over again to us their beliefs and expectations. This on-going self-talk affects the way we feel about ourselves and the way we view our place in the world.

It is possible to change our self-talk, though, and replace old, negative messages with new, positive ones. This can be done through techniques such as affirmations, for example "I live only in this moment", a method for developing healthy, productive messages. It is also possible to learn to recognise and counteract our negative self-talk in everyday situations.

When we are awake and not talking aloud or listening intently, we are almost constantly "talking to ourselves". It is as if we have been collecting "tapes" in our mind since birth that plays, sometimes repeatedly. When we add a new bit of information, it goes on the tape without evaluation. As we talk to ourselves, what we say affects how we feel – angry, confident, relaxed, upset, insecure, etc. One of our tasks is to question some of those tapes and change some of them, even though there are strong impulses not to. Secondly, we can make new tapes. Our standards and expectations, along with everything else we think and believe, are on those tapes. Let's work at making the tapes we listen to positive, fair and realistic.
