We were delighted to find out that Sophie Telford came 1st out of all Senior Infant pupils in the Diocese in the Bishop's Art Competition.


We hosted this year's Choral Festival in St. Peter's Church on June 14th.lt was so lovely to see the church so full and the singing was outstanding.
