The Rector Writes

Gone Fishing

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was thrown into the sea and gathered fish of every kind. When it was full, men drew it ashore and sat down and sorted the good into containers but threw away the bad. So it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come out and separate the evil from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. "Have you understood all these things?" They said to him, "Yes." (Matthew 13:47-51)

I don't like fish, so I've never tried fishing. Admittedly I'll occasionally eat a cod but I couldn't describe what one looked like. All I do know about fish and fishing is that if you throw a net into a river you'll probably haul in a shopping trolley or an old tyre - it's better to use a rod. Jesus and his fishermen disciples knew full well that when a net is thrown into the sea it catches every fish that can't get through. A net doesn't pick and choose, it takes everything it can. The church is like a net thrown into a sea of humanitv. and rightly so, because on the noticeboards it says: All are welcome; rich or poor. black or white, sinner and non-sinner. All are welcome to enter our church. Jesus asks the disciples if they have understood him, and they reply "Yes." Thus Jesus wants us to be clear on what it means to fish with a net: invite everyone to enter our church. Let us leave judgment to the Lord, for who we are to judge, and let's leave the sifting out to the angels who will sort the evil from the righteous at the end of the age. As our churches begin to reopen, let us humbly continue to cast our nets and hopefully guide people into our church, and let us share our love of the Lord with them. Ultimately we pray that we will live out our faith with the goal in mind that we will lead others to eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.
