

Roy Campanella was a catcher for the Brooklyn Dodgers. Tragically, he was in a car accident which left him paralyzed from the waist down.

#### A CREED FOR THOSE WHO HAVE SUFFERED

I asked God for strength, that I might achieve.
I was made weak, that I might learn humbly to obey.
I asked for health, that I might do great things.
I was given infirmity, that I might do better things.
I asked for riches, that I might be happy.
I was given poverty, that I might be wise.
I asked for power, that I might have the praise of men.
I was given weakness, that I might feel the need of God.
I asked for all things, that I might enjoy life.
I was given life, that I might enjoy all things.
I got nothing I asked for – but everything I had hoped for.
Almost despite myself, my unspoken prayers were answered.
I am among men, most richly blessed.

This poem was written on a plaque in the rehabilitation centre that was used by Roy Campanella. He found it an inspiration as he worked through his rehabilitation and ultimate acceptance that he would be a quadriplegic for the rest of his life. In spite of his physical condition, Roy Campanella saw himself as "richly blessed."

This creed is hung on a wall at the waiting room of Institute of Rehabilitation Medicine, 400 East 34th Street, NYC.
