The Rector Writes

Transfiguration

We know from scripture that Jesus frequently took time to himself to pray, and on this occasion he took Peter, James and John along with him. While they were praying something wonderful occurred. Jesus was transfigured; his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white.

Composing himself after the initial shock, Peter says: 'Master, it is good for us to be here' (Luke 9:33, KJV). However, more importantly than what Peter said, is what they all heard: 'This is my Son, my chosen: hear ye him' (Luke 9:35, KJV). These words are as much meant for us today as they were for those who first heard them.

Today, we are bombarded constantly by information trying to grab our attention, and not all of it good, wholesome or true. We have 24/7 news on our TVs, news from around the world via social media and the internet, and of course we have the more traditional news and information sources of print media and radio.

The words that Jesus speaks to us are true. They are life-giving, lifeaffirming, and life-changing. The words of Jesus encourage, instruct, and sustain us, if we will only open our minds and hearts to hear it.

The Transfiguration gives us a fleeting glimpse of Jesus in all his magnificent glory. It is offered to us to encourage and challenge us in our daily lives. It reminds us that our lives are far more than what see, hear, and experience every day. It is not just a matter of getting through the day.

Following Jesus is about living with meaning, purpose and hope. The Transfiguration not only offers us a glimpse of Jesus in all his glory, it also offers each of us a foretaste of what God promises each of us in the fullness of the Kingdom.
