## The Rector Writes

#### **May Day**

This May Day – Monday 1st May – we give thanks to God for our jobs, careers, studies, training & apprenticeships, and our lives in the home. For those of us who have retired, we look back with gratitude on our past labours and the joys that came into our lives. We also pause to think of others who are working multiple jobs and yet who are still struggling to make ends meet. Our thoughts turn too to those who are unable to work through disability; those between jobs; those who have come to our country to seek employment; and those who have no work. We also give God thanks for employers: for those farm & business owners – large and small – who have brought a livelihood and dignity to others through providing employment.

In his Gospel St Luke recounts Jesus' declaration of his mission: 'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor (Luke 4:18, NIV). Later, Luke records the parable of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31), where Jesus challenges the consciences of those who are blessed to have plenty, and to inspire an awareness in us to look out for the less fortunate. Jesus calls the rich to assist the poor and to bolster the dignity to those who have little.

We have so many distractions in our lives that we can often be unintentionally diverted from the needs of our brothers and sisters in Christ, and much worse, intentionally disinterested in the cry of the poor and the needy. Today, Jesus invites us to open our hearts and minds to those oppressed by the worries and burdens of life: paying bills, finding a home, educating our children, caring for incapacitated relatives and friends, servicing debt and so too to be aware of our own needs such as minding our health. We cannot aid others or be there for those around us if we neglect our own well-being. Let us this May Day ask God for what Dorothy Day called 'a revolution of the heart' and so demand dignity for all, especially those living in extreme poverty and powerlessness, and the Lord's blessing and strength in helping our fellow people.
