Mountrath Table Tennis Club

Blazing a trail through Irish Junior table tennis Laois girl Amylou Hayes followed on her recent all Ireland exploits by taking awards in UIO,12 & 14 at the recent Leinster Championships in Dublin.

Starting the event by picking up Player of The Year award at U10 for overall performance in 07/08 she followed that by carving her way through a quality field of U12 to set up a fantastic final against a very formidable opponent in Maynooth's Kate Connerty. This epic match was loaded with blistering attack, sizzling chops and devilish spins, with the Mountrath girl winning the first and third sets while Connerty captured sets two and four. Set five became a real ding dong battle of wits where anything was possible and at 9-9 you could hear a pin drop. Here Haves held her nerve to score a powerful wide forehand and then forced an error from her opponent to claim a 11-9 win and 3-2 in sets.

With this out of the way she set her sights on U14 where the standard was even greater and here she found a level which will take much to crack. However she qualified for level 2 and went all the way to capture the winning trophy .Coming away with these three awards on the day certainly put the Midlands back on the map in table tennis and will be a hard act for any player to follow.

Meanwhile, her sister Katie came second in the U10 Division where a flock of new and ambitious young kids are coming through.
