Lent Explained

The word Lent comes to us from an Old English word meaning "Spring". Spring is a time of rebirth and renewal, and this is why it gave its name to the Christian season of renewal and reflection. Lent is the period of 40 days which comes before Easter, beginning on Ash Wednesday. It is a solemn time of prayer and preparation before the joyful celebration of Christ's triumph over death at Easter. By observing the 40 days of Lent, Christians replicate our Saviour's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days. Ultimately the purpose of Lent is giving the Christian believer time to examine his/her life and prepare themselves for Easter through prayer, doing penance, repentance of sins, and almsgiving. Lent is observed in the Anglican, Orthodox, Lutheran, Methodist, Reformed and Roman Catholic Churches.



GO PLACIDLY amid the noise and the haste, and remember what peace there may be in silence. As far as possible, without surrender, be on good terms with all persons.

Speak your truth quietly and clearly; and listen to others, even to the dull and the ignorant; they too have their story.

Avoid loud and aggressive persons; they are vexatious to the spirit. If you compare yourself with others, you may become vain or bitter, for always there will be greater and lesser persons than yourself.

Enjoy your achievements as well as your plans. Keep interested in your own career, however humble; it is a real possession in the changing fortunes of time.

Exercise caution in your business affairs, for the world is full of trickery.

But let this not blind you to what virtue there is; many persons strive for high ideals,
and everywhere life is full of heroism.

Be yourself. Especially do not feign affection. Neither be cynical about love; for in the face of all aridity and disenchantment, it is as perennial as the grass.

Take kindly the counsel of the years, gracefully surrendering the things of youth.

Nurture strength of spirit to shield you in sudden misfortune. But do not distress yourself with dark imaginings. Many fears are born of fatigue and loneliness.

Beyond a wholesome discipline, be gentle with yourself. You are a child of the universe no less than the trees and the stars; you have a right to be here.

And whether or not it is clear to you, no doubt the universe is unfolding as it should. Therefore be at peace with God, whatever you conceive Him to be. And whatever your labors and aspirations, in the noisy confusion of life, keep peace in your soul. With all its sham, drudgery and broken dreams, it is still a beautiful world.

Be cheerful. Strive to be happy.
