The Rector Writes

Reflecting With An Advent Wreath

Advent wreaths are one of the most iconic symbols of Advent. As a symbol of Christ's eternal presence, it is a beautiful one. Apart from being lit on each Sunday of Advent, the deeper meaning of each candle is often lost or overlooked. It is a pity because there is a richness to the wreath that offers real opportunities for prayerful reflection leading up to Christmas. In order to understand how we might use an Advent Wreath for reflection, let's first recall its origins.

It was in the Middle Ages that the Advent wreath first appeared in homes and churches. During the dark and cold winter, candles and greenery were symbols of light and life in pre-Christian Germanic and Scandinavian cultures. It has always been a circular evergreen wreath with either four red candles, or three purple candles (and one rose) and also sometimes with a central white candle for Christmas Day.

The candles symbolise the light of Christ coming into the world. The evergreen symbolises renewal and the circular shape the completeness of God. The candle colours come from the traditional liturgical colours of Advent: (red and purple) and Christmas: (white). Beginning with the First Sunday of Advent, each candle is lit on the appropriate Sunday. Over the years each candle was given a name and linked to a particular part of the Advent story...

Candle 1. Hope (red or purple) Candle 2. Peace (red or purple) Candle 3. Joy (red or rose)

Candle 4. Love (red or purple)

Praying with a focus on each candle can really help us to reflect as we journey through Advent. Just taking a quarter of an hour each day to pray can enrich our appreciation of the season which so often can be overtaken by the need to shop, bake, and the general hectic rush of getting things done before Christmas. Simply giving a short period of time allows us to pause and refocus on why we are doing all this preparation in the first place.
